"That summer, I understood for the first time the awesome power of the law to heal or to hurt real people... in a sense, law was life for our clients." — Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson, The Lovely One.

This past month, we witnessed the law's power to heal, restore, and transform in the most profound way. At Shimo La Tewa Prison, 33 remarkable individuals—15 inmates and 18 officers—graduated paralegals, stepping into their newfound roles as champions of justice.

Their journey was nothing short of extraordinary. Over two weeks, they immersed themselves in legal knowledge, unlocking the ability to advocate for themselves and **others**. And the impact was immediate—twenty-eight(28) prisoners have already secured their freedom, including one of our graduates!

The energy at the graduation was electric-smiles, cheers, and even tears of joy. One graduate summed it up perfectly: "I came into this training feeling hopeless like my life was over. But today, I feel like I have a purpose."

But the celebrations didn't stop there. On World Day of Social Justice, we took our mission further, visiting Lang'ata Women's Prison to stand in solidarity with incarcerated mothers. We listened to their stories, offered legal support, and reaffirmed our commitment to ensuring that no one is forgotten in the pursuit of justice. These women—many of whom are held for minor offences, some unable to afford bail as low as Ksh 3,000—remind us why we must continue advocating for a system that is fair, family-centric, and accessible to all.











This is the essence of our work at Justice Nest—ensuring that justice is not a privilege, but a right. As we celebrate this milestone, we also look ahead with determination, knowing that there are many more lives to uplift and many more voices to empower.

### 2. 33 Champions of Justice: A New Dawn for Access to Justice

This month, the Justice Nest team had the privilege of witnessing something truly extraordinary—the graduation of 15 inmates and 18 officers at Shimo La Tewa Prison in Mombasa as paralegals. Over two transformative weeks, we worked side by side with these remarkable individuals, sharing knowledge, laughter, and even a few tears. But the highlight of it all? The graduation ceremony, where hope and determination took centre stage. And the best part? Since the training, twenty-eight (28) prisoners have been **released**, with one of our graduates among them.

The journey began with an ambitious goal: to empower inmates with the legal knowledge and skills they need to advocate for themselves and others. For many of the participants, this was their first opportunity to engage in such a program. The training covered everything from understanding legal rights to navigating court processes, and the enthusiasm in the room was palpable. Each day brought new lessons, new connections, and a growing sense of purpose among the trainees.

But it wasn't all serious—we made sure to infuse the training with moments of joy. Interactive games and team-building activities broke the ice and brought smiles to faces that had seen too much hardship. And then there was the food. Justice Nest arranged for hearty, delicious meals throughout the training, a rare treat for many of the participants. One inmate shared, "This is the first proper meal I've had in over 10 years. I can't remember the last time I tasted something so good." It was a small gesture, but one that meant the world to them.

As the days passed, we saw incredible growth in the participants. They began to ask insightful questions, share their own experiences, and even help each other understand complex legal concepts. One trainee, a mother of three, told us, "I've been here for years, and I've felt invisible. But now, I know my rights, and I know how to fight for them. This training has given me hope for my future and my children's future."

The graduation ceremony was the culmination of this incredible journey. The room was filled with a sense of pride and accomplishment as each participant received their certificate, marking their official graduation as paralegals. For many, it was the first time they had been recognized for their achievements in years. The smiles on their faces, the tears in their eyes, and the applause from their peers made it clear just how much this moment meant.

One graduate stood up to speak, his voice trembling with emotion. "I came into this training feeling hopeless like my life was over. But today, I feel like I have a purpose. I can help others who are lost in the system, just like I was. Thank you for seeing us, for believing in us."

At Justice Nest, we believe that knowledge is power, and this graduation was a testament to that belief. These new graduate paralegals are now equipped to advocate











for themselves and their fellow inmates, creating a ripple effect of change within the prison walls. They are proof that even in the darkest places, hope can shine through.

And the impact didn't stop at graduation. Since the training, twenty-eight(28) prisoners have been released, thanks to the legal knowledge and advocacy skills they gained. One of our graduates was among them, a moment that brought tears of joy to our team. "I never thought this day would come," he said. "This training gave me the tools to fight for my freedom, and now I can start rebuilding my life."

But our work doesn't stop here. Out of 135 prisons in Kenya, only about 25 prisons have an active paralegal program, the need is still so great and we look forward to expanding this program to other prisons. We will have a monthly education day to ensure that the paralegal team has the best knowledge and skills to offer quality service. The paralegals will work alongside our advocate who will offer continuous training, support and mentorship.

## 3. Impact Spotlight: Standing with Incarcerated Mothers on World Day of Social **Justice**

This February, in honour of **World Day of Social Justice**, the Justice Nest team visited Lang'ata Women's Prison to mark the day under the theme Justice for All. Our mission was clear: to provide legal services, listen to the stories of women in remand, and advocate for their rights.











For many of the women we met, the reality of their situation is heartbreaking. They are mothers, separated from their children, and trapped in a system that often feels unjust. Some have bail set as low as Ksh 3,000 (~\$20), yet they remain in remand for months, unable to pay. Others shared stories of unfair legal processes, with some not even knowing where their children are. These stories remind us why our work is so critical.

During our visit, the Justice Nest team conducted one-on-one sessions with over 100 potential clients, offering legal advice and interviewing women to understand their cases better. We educated them on the trial process, their rights, and the importance of legal representation. For many, this was the first time they felt heard and understood.

At Justice Nest, we believe in diversion, especially for mothers, as a way to restore dignity and hope. Our team is committed to ensuring that these women receive fair representation and that their voices are heard in the pursuit of justice.

This visit was a powerful reminder of the systemic barriers that many face and the urgent need for accessible legal services. It also reinforced our commitment to advocating for restorative justice and equitable access to legal representation for all.

#### What's Next?

The stories we heard at Lang'ata Women's Prison will guide our work in the coming months. We are committed to:

- Providing legal representation to the mothers we interviewed.
- Advocating for policy changes that address systemic injustices.
- Continuing our efforts to ensure that no one is denied justice due to socioeconomic barriers.

Outside the courtroom, Asha enjoys cooking and creating TikTok content, balancing her demanding career with personal interests through effective time management.












In the next five years, Asha aims to make significant strides in criminal litigation, advocating for initiatives that make legal services more accessible and affordable.
